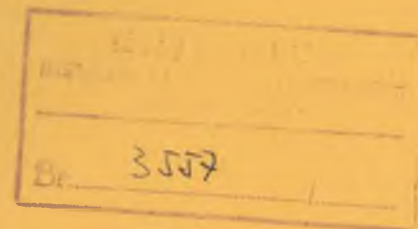

If each of us were to bring in new members and promote the activities of the Council in our own national or regional area, it would be a substantial service in our growth and development.

I thank you all for your continuing friendly help and co-operation. We look forward to another challenging Conference in 1971.
